Step 1:

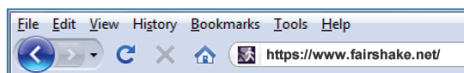
Find a computer. Public libraries have free computers with internet access. Restaurants, cafes, and many other businesses offer free internet access for customers who bring their own computers.
